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

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
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Publisher's Message



MONTBLANC'S TRIBUTE TO SIR ARTHUR CONAN DOYLE

Montblanc memorializes the literary work and adventurous life of Sherlock Holmes creator Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, in four limited editions.





rom the extraordinary real life of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, medical doctor, writer and adventurer, sprung nearly 200 novels, short stories, poems, historical books and pamphlets. Whole fictional worlds emerged from the tip of Sir Arthur's pen, not least of which are *The Lost World* and 60 volumes following the adventures of legendary detective, Sherlock Holmes.

Made from precious resin, the most widely available edition in this year's collection features ruthenium coated fittings and a ruthenium coated Au 750 solid gold nib. Engraved with a portrait of the author, the nib also bears the likeness of Pterodactyl dinosaurs from *The Lost World*. Engraved on the cap and barrel is a pattern based on an original Sherlock Holmes tartan, and portions of a street map of Victorian London, highlighting the location of Doyle's medical practice on Upper Wimpole Street, and the fictional residence of Sherlock Holmes on Baker Street.

Behind the clip, the initials "JB" pay tribute to Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's medical professor, Joshua Bell, a master of deduction and diagnosis who was the inspiration behind the character of Sherlock Holmes. Above the magnifying glass, a red lacquer dot represents an ophthalmoscope from the 19th century, representing Doyle's medical practice.

Limited to 1,902 fountain pens and 1,902 rollerballs, the 1902 Edition is a reference to the first publishing date of *The Hound of Baskervilles*. Evoking Holmes' smoking pipe, the 1902 edition sports a cap top and cone crafted from wood and matching brown lacquer cap and barrel. Lurking behind the clip, a Super-LumiNova® hound from *The Hound of The Baskervilles* glows in the dark. The edition is completed with a rhodium-coated Au 750 solid gold nib, engraved with a portrait of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and a magnifying glass.







Completed in 1897, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's family home, Undershaw, was where the author penned some of his most important works. Commemorating this special place, the Writers Edition Sir Arthur Conan Doyle Limited Edition 97 is enveloped within an Au 750 solid white gold skeletonized overlay, revealing translucent lacquer panels inspired by Undershaw's stained-glass windows. Depicted within the pattern of the barrel's overlay, a street map design features Victoria Street, where Doyle and his wife opened a psychic bookshop. A rhodium and ruthenium coated Au 750 solid gold nib engraved with a portrait of Conan Doyle finishes the piece, and includes a ship's mast from Doyle's short story, *The Captain of the Pole Star*.

An ardent adventurer, Doyle took to the Arctic Circle aboard a whaling boat as ship's surgeon at just 20 years old. Immortalizing this real-life adventure, the Sir Arthur Conan Doyle Limited Edition 8 is engraved around its cap top ring with the words: *I CAME OF AGE AT 80*^e *NORTH LATITUDE* (a line written by Doyle in his diary on his 21st birthday). Adorned with 3-dimensional icebergs in solid Au 750 white gold with a background of translucent blue lacquer, the Edition of 8 pieces is fitted with an Au 750 solid white gold nib adorned with an engraving in yellow of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle and a ship's mast from *The Captain of the Pole Star*.

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Tempting Fate

MONTEGRAPPA INTRODUCES TWO NEW COLLECTIONS WITH THE POWER TO REWRITE DESTINY

Montegrappa releases the newest in its Dante Alighieri Divina Commedia series, the Purgatorio, as-well-as a new collection in exquisite Japanese lacquer from Zohiko.



ollaborating with Japanese lacquerware house, Zohiko, Montegrappa has create the Kitcho writing collection as an invocation of good fortune. Rich with mystical meaning, a variety of talismanic creatures are painstakingly painted using *urushi* lacquer brushwork and delicate *maki-e* application on a lathed acrylic barrel. Accented by Montegrappa's renowned metal work in sterling silver and vermeil, the Kitcho collection features eight creatures in limited editions of eight pieces, each: the *Hebi* or Snake; *Houou* or Phoenix; *Koumori* or Bat; *Kujyaku* or Peacock; *Shishi* or Lion; *Suzume* or Sparrow; *Tora* or Tiger; and the *Tsuru* or Crane.

At the base of each barrel is the representation of an *uzu* or vortex, said to represent eternal vitality, power and prosperity. Adorning the 8 mm, 18-karat gold, two-tone nib is an *ougi*, or fan, with its triangular *suehiro* shape, implying growing success. On their caps, each Kitcho edition is emblazoned with *take*, or bamboo, considered a symbol of strength for its evergreen vibrancy and fertility. Designed to bring good fortune to its owner, the Kitcho collection's eight limited editions may be as much a tool of fate as an instrument for writing.







Following on the heels of the *Inferno* (2021) and ahead of the *Paradiso* – scheduled for release in 2022 – the second of Montegrappa's Dante Alighieri Divina Commedia trilogy, *Purgatorio*, has now been released for collectors eager to acquire the full set.

Illustrating Dante and Virgil's ascent of Mount Purgatory from barrel cap to crown, intricate lost-wax caste scenes unfold through seven rings, representing Purgatory's seven terraces and their punishments. Seeking to be absolve of *Peccatum* (sin) by the angels, Dante is reunited with Beatrice, and is prepared for his ascent to Heaven. Denoting the passage through Peter's Gate, great gold and silver keys adorn the cap as an elaborately sculpted clip. Crafted from resin and sterling silver or solid gold, with delicate *cloisonné* work, the *Purgatorio* is available as both fountain pen or rollerball in limited editions of 333 pieces in sterling silver and 9 pieces in 18-karat yellow gold. For those who plan to use their *Purgatorio*, the collection is endowed with a wide range of nibs, including extra fine, fine, medium, broad, double broad, and stub 1.1 mm – showing Montegrappa's skill as both penmaker and nib maker. Perhaps more ominous than a talisman of good fortune, the *Purgatorio* reminds us of the darker side of fate, and that it is in the hands of the living to change it.

全新万宝龙大文豪系列阿瑟·柯南·道尔爵士限量款书写工具,全球限量发行 97 支,旨在纪念阿瑟·柯南 ·道尔爵士位于英国萨里故居"安德肖(Undershaw)"的竣工年份 1897 年。在这里他创作了许多脍炙 人口的代表作,其中包括《巴斯克维尔的猎犬》。该书写工具以多种颜色半透明漆面为底,覆盖 18K 白 金镂空造型,灵感来自于故居"安德肖"中的精美绝伦的彩色玻璃窗。

笔杆饰有伦敦街道地图和象征"维多利亚街"的格纹图案,这是柯南·道尔与妻子开设的伦敦灵魂书店 所在地。

笔夹饰有可拆卸放大镜,并镌刻柯南·道尔的姓名首字母,设计灵感来自其故居"安德肖"中彩色玻璃 窗上的的姓名缩写。

David Oscarson has been creating luxury fountain pens since 2000 when he launched his eponymous brand with the limited edition Henrik Wigstrom Trophy pen collection. Since then, he has created numerous limited edition pen collections – four of which have been the recipients of the *Robb Report*'s annual Best of the Best award, and the prestigious Readers' Choice Award for the Jacques de Molay collection – each one a personal tribute to the art of writing.

"The biggest challenge today is helping people remember what a signature means: that it is an extension of one's self," says Oscarson. "Much is electronic today, including communication, but I always prefer talking on the phone to texting, and visiting in person to the telephone – old-fashioned, maybe, but much richer, and in my mind, much more rewarding."

He takes this same mindful approach to the production of his pens. The use of hand-rendered and guilloché enamel, traditional art forms also seen in watchmaking, are emblematic of the brand, and Oscarson takes great care in keeping their quality pure. For example, he makes it eminently clear that the metal parts of his pens are guilloché, as opposed to stamped, since the resulting pattern reflects light in just the right way. Similarly, Oscarson uses exclusive enameling techniques to enrobe his pens as opposed to more cost-effective methods whose results do not meet his standards.

"It is a painstaking multi-step process requiring hours of grinding, applying, firing, filing, and polishing to achieve the layer of kiln-fired glass that covers the engraved body of the pen," explains Oscarson. "We use no epoxies, resins, or other so-called 'soft enamels' in this process."

"My favorite part of the business," he shares, "is seeing an idea or concept become a real, 'living' thing."







Hard Enamel

Using a mortar and pestle, a composition of glass, water and metal oxides is ground for hours by hand. When settled, the water is removed, leaving the fine paste that is the basis for hard enamel. A quill is then used to apply each coat of the mixture to the surface of the metal, ensuring that the entire guilloché area is completely covered in enamel. The components are then fired in a furnace at temperatures exceeding 1,000° F, fusing the enamel to the metal and forming a layer of glass.







After cooling, the pieces are manually ground with a diamond file, restoring their proper shape and surface. This tedious process is repeated at length until the level of enamel reaches the depth required to cover the peaks and fill the valleys of each intricate guilloché pattern. When the final stages of firing are completed, the pieces are polished and buffed, revealing the velvet finish of translucent hard enamel.

Production of translucent hard enamel demands the highest levels of patience, experience and skill. A five-year apprenticeship is required to ensure that the highest levels of quality will be met in each individual collection piece.













Nib & Filling System

David Oscarson's unique filling system accommodates a cartridge, converter or eyedropper fill; a series of seals and "O" rings prevents the ink from leaving the chamber at any point. A roller ball version of each Oscarson Collection piece is also available.

Engineered in Heidelberg, Germany, the 18-karat gold nib is unsurpassed in quality and form. Coupled with an ebonite feeder, each nib is plated with rhodium and tipped with iridium to ensure durability in fine, medium and broad sizes.

First appearing on a wristwatch in 1914, represented as a spotted coat of diamonds and onyx, the iconic panther was chosen this year to be *the* Cartier signature. Featuring prominently within Cartier's current Precious, high jewellery collection of exceptional timepieces, the Panthère Songeuse celebrates this majestic feline.

Dazzling in diamonds, sapphires and emeralds, the Panthère Songeuse collection unites the Maison's two specialties, *métiers d'art* and fine watchmaking, to create some of the year's most exclusive pieces. Describing the marriage of these two crafts, Marie-Laure Cerede, Director of Design for Watchmaking at Cartier, explains:

"Because Cartier is above all a jeweller, Cartier watches, whether they are for men or women, blur the lines between these two founding professions of the Maison, allowing for the best of both worlds. This is why our creations transcend all categories. They are not just instruments for telling the time, nor are they simply jewellery. They are a third type of object with their own uniqueness. Cartier watches only resemble themselves." For those with a penchant for colour, Cartier has introduced a *champlevé* enamel edition, limited to just 30 pieces. Crafted exclusively within the Maison des Métiers d'Art in La Chaux-de-Fonds, Cartier's atelier for rare and specialized techniques applied within the world of watchmaking, the *champlevé* enamel applied to this edition requires four days to be completed. First, enamel powder is deposited in tiny cavities in the metal, adding five different colours to the dial and bezel. After firing, the polisher then adds final touches which soften the gradient effect of the enamel.

Fitted with a 28.4 mm 18-karat white gold case, finished in rhodium, the Panthère Songeuse is a truly spectacular way to mark the most precious of occasions. Whether your inspiration is flowing formality or a touch of something wild, Cartier's iconic panther remains timelessly vigilant, guarding the hours and those who pass through them.

Reversing Time THE REVERSO CELEBRATES ITS 90TH YEAR

The watch that brought haute horlogerie to the polo field still brings a fresh touch of sophistication to any man's style. Jaeger-LeCoultre celebrates the Reverso's 90th anniversary with its most complicated model to date and an enchanting minute repeater. ne of the great style icons of the horological world, the Jaeger-LeCoultre Reverso has been revered as a technical marvel, object of fascination and an eternally fashionable accessory. The product of an age when legendary timepieces were born to support the pioneers, adventurers and explorers who would conquer the world by air, land and sea, the Reverso remains at the cutting edge of horological innovation. Now celebrating its 90th anniversary, the true innovation of the Reverso, however, has been shown to lie neither in its mechanism nor its function, but in its unyielding uniqueness of character.

Returning from a trip to India, it was intrepid entrepreneur César de Trey who carried with him a challenge from British army officers to create a watch that could be worn on the polo field without being smashed. Born within nine months, from conceptualization to retail counter, the Reverso's creation was, itself, a masterwork of planning and production. First entering public records on March 4th 1931, was a design by French industrial designer, René-Alfred Chauvot, submitted to a Paris patent office. The application's description was for "*a watch capable of sliding in its support and being completely turned over.*" Subsequently purchased by de Trey, the design was dubbed the *Reverso*, and was registered that November. In less than nine months after the patent application had been filed, de Trey and his partner, Jacques-David LeCoultre, began selling the timepieces they were producing.

Widely embraced for its elegant Art Deco style, the Reverso's popularity grew and waned. It was not until 1985 that the Reverso would be meaningfully reborn, when a new case machined at Jaeger-LeCoultre was first unveiled. Stylistically unchanged, the Reverso would go on to become an entire collection in 1991, more recently expanded to include dual faces and larger sizes.

Famously designed to protect its crystal from the notoriously indelicate game of polo, perhaps the Reverso's greatest feat is surviving the ravishes of time, fashions and technology, to remain a horological style icon. And on this, its 90th anniversary, we salute it.





Playing host to skeletonized platinum movements and industry challenging gyro-tourbillons, Jaeger-LeCoultre's Reverso has been the stage for some of the Maison's most dramatic *Hybris Mechanica* calibres. Honouring the 90th anniversary year of the Reverso, Jaeger-LeCoultre endowed it with its most complicated movement to date, the Reverso Hybris Mechanica Calibre 185 (Quadriptyque).

Featuring four faces, including two on the pivoting case's cradle, the Calibre 185 housed a total of eleven complications, requiring twelve patents. Displayed on two faces were tourbillon, minute repeater and innovative Instantaneous Perpetual Calendar functions, with a third face dedicated to a Northern Hemisphere moon phase, draconic lunar cycle (height of the moon) and anomalistic lunar cycle (apogee and perigee). Turning the entire case and cradle over revealed a fourth face, upon which the Southern Hemisphere moon phase was displayed.

Closing the celebrations this winter, and 150 years after creating its first minute repeater, Jaeger-LeCoultre has released the Reverso Tribute Minute Repeater. Powered by a revised version of its calibre 944, the Tribute Minute Repeater features patented trebuchet hammers, silent regulator and a new generation of gongs. Measuring 51.1 mm by 31 mm, the rose-gold case of the limited edition houses a delicately skeletonize front dial, revealing the minute repeater mechanism below a large bow-shaped bridge that sweeps from 11 o'clock to 7 o'clock. Enhanced by faceted indexes and a *chemin de fer* minutes track fixed on a crystal dial, the Tribute Minute Repeater exposes layer after layer of its inner workings in seemingly endless depth.

And so, with a bright future ahead as a high horology sport watch that can handle all of life, the Reverso lives on – not for the variety of its models or the innovations that it encases, but by its unyielding uniqueness of character.

for us," once noted Günter Blümlein, "Our watches must be classic and understated in looks, sleek, useful, and essentially German in nature." Showing that industry-shaping technical advancements and design innovations can arise outside of the Swiss watch industry, A. Lange & Söhne is blazing its own trail, and collectors are taking notice.

Following the release of the Double Split in 2004, the first release of the Triple Split in 2018 unveiled the world's only mechanical split-seconds chronograph that allowed the measurement of intermediate and reference times for durations of up to twelve hours. Powered by the Lange calibre L132.1,

comprised of 567 parts, the A. Lange & Söhne Triple Split has now been released in a limited edition of 100 timepieces, all featuring a pink gold case with a blue dial and rhodié-coloured sub-dials.

Joining the Triple Split, the Langematik Perpetual has the distinction of being the first mechanical wristwatch to combine a perpetual calendar with the Lange over-sized date. Setting it apart from other perpetual calendars, the Langematik Perpetual features a zero-reset mechanism and a main corrector for simultaneously advancing all calendar displays. In celebration of its 20th year, the Langematik Perpetual is being made available in white gold or pink gold with a blue dial, in a limited edition of 50 pieces each.





In an age when even the most revered high horology brands are pulling traditional models from their catalogues because they do not conform to popular tastes, A. Lange & Söhne's approach of '*Progress by standstill*' has proved to only capture the attention and whet the appetites of collectors all the more. Reviving the classical rectangle, Lange's Cabaret Tourbillon Handwerkskunst features an in-house platinum case and three-part solid white gold dial. Manually engraved with a lozenge pattern, the inner portion of the Cabaret Tourbillon's dial is coated with a semi-transparent enamel layer, accenting its depth and creating a three-dimensional effect.

Boasting a feature first debuted by Lange in 2008, the Cabaret Tourbillon's manually wound calibre L042.1 features the ability to stop the balance wheel inside the tourbillon's cage, instantaneously providing an exacting time. As Lange describes it: "By pulling the crown, a complex lever mechanism is triggered that pivots a movable V-shaped spring onto the balance wheel rim. The balance stops instantaneously... An advantage of this design is that it preserves the potential energy of the balance spring so that the balance can restart instantly as soon as the arresting spring is retracted when the crown is pushed home."

Housing a twin mainspring barrel with a power reserve of 120 hours, the calibre L042.1 is constructed from 370 parts – of which 84 are allotted to the filigreed tourbillon that weighs only a quarter of a gram. Limited to 30 pieces, the Cabaret Tourbillon Handwerkskunst measures 29.5 mm by 39.2 mm, and is equipped with a deployant buckle in platinum and a black leather strap with grey contrast stitching.

Leading with innovation and remaining constant in style, A. Lange & Söhne has risen to the top the high horology world with a formula for success that defies industry standards. Neither moved by trends nor complacent in its popularity, Lange remains true to the art of timelessness in a world that is chasing the times.

Bentley's Flying Spur finds its wings with a hand-made version of the benchmark sedan, designed and built by the oldest coachbuilder in the world, the legendary Mulliner.





s the saying goes, "In the world of Mulliner, anything is possible." Builder of dreams and coach builder to the most discerning of Bentley's clients, Mulliner is a hallowed name on the lips of true Bentley aficionados. Based at the home of Bentley in Crewe, England, Mulliner is the oldest coach-builder in the world, and now the centre of Bentley's bespoke division.

Emerging from the Mulliner facility at Crewe for the first time in 2021, the new Bentley Flying Spur Mulliner takes its place as the flagship model of the Bentley line-up. The hand-made version of Bentley's already updated Flying Spur boasts Mulliner illuminated outer treadplates and deep-pile over-mats, and is distinguished by a selection of eight custommade, three-colour interiors. Hand-stitched seats feature accent colour piping and Mulliner's unique "*Diamond-in-Diamond*" embroidery, with each quilted diamond containing exactly 712 individual stitches aligned to the centre of the diamond it surrounds.

Maintaining Bentley's progressive design language throughout, three-dimensional leather work clads the doors, with a diamond-milled technical finish gracing the centre and rear consoles.

Not to be left out – and perhaps the best place to enjoy the opulence of the Flying Spur – the rear seats form a sumptuous cocoon, with centre-console executive seating and separate sunroof. Mounted to the front seats, veneered picnic tables with a leather-trimmed surface offer a place for work or leisure while underway. Now electrically-operated, the selfleveling tables can be lowered or raised with the touch of button, tastefully bringing one of Bentley's most iconic accessories into the modern world.









Under its hood the Flying Spur continues to impress, living up to the motto of its founder, W. O. Bentley: "*To build a fast car, a good car, the best in its class.*" Available with a new V6 Hybrid or Bentley's famous V8, it is the 6.0-litre, twinturbocharged W12 that allows the Flying Spur to travel from 0-60 mph in 3.7 seconds and reach a top speed of 207 mph. Alternatively, the new generation 4.0-litre, twin turbocharged V8 performs 0-60 mph in 4.0 seconds with a top speed of 198 mph, and the new V6 Hybrid – Mulliner's first electric motorpowered car – has a 0-60 mph time of 4.1 seconds with a top speed of 177 mph.







hen General Manager Christophe Chabre and Executive Chef Pascal Georges introduce something from their native France, west coast gourmands take notice. Stepping in front of sweeping harbour and mountain views, Christophe began setting out the procession of garnishes, blini and caviar which make Five Sails restaurant a destination for locals and visitors alike.

Served on Kaviari's signature chilled oak pedestal and accompanied by delicate blini triangles, the classic caviar service is offered with sevruga, ossetra or beluga caviar from Paris-based caviar house, Kaviari. Sourced from Bulgaria, the Prestige Osciètre glistens dark olive-brown, with a delicate briny overture and the gentle, mildly nutty finish for which Russian Sturgeon roe is known.

The personal preference of GM Christophe, we likewise recommend pairing the Prestige Osciètre with a slightly savoury palate of red onions and chives, which accentuate the milder piscine notes for which ossetra caviar is prized.

Terminal City Club Wine Director DJ Kearney's

While our nose can distinguish and remember thousands of scents, the tongue has receptors for only five flavours: sweet, sour, salty, bitter and umami. The best food and wine pairings pay attention to the interactions between these five flavours, which can be found in both the food and in the wine.

A few basic guidelines can help you pair like a pro. The first step is to relax! Most food and wine get along nicely. There are few hard and fast rules about matching food flavours, but a few guiding principles can be very helpful.

There are two fundamental pairing approaches: **CONTRASTING & COMPLEMENTING**.

Match similar elements of flavour and texture together in a complementary fashion – like a rich chardonnay with opulent crab or lobster. Just as successful is a complete contrast, such as a salty foie gras pâté and a sweet wine like Sauternes or BC ice wine.

The Colour Guideline is always safe and reliable:

• White wine with fish or white meat and red wine with red meat.

The Weight and Intensity Guideline

- If the food is deeply flavourful, the wine must be too match power with power.
- Consider the intensity of the grape variety: Cabernet Sauvignon is more intense than Pinot Noir and Chardonnay is more powerful than Riesling.
- Winemaking methods that can add weight and flavour to wine, such as new oak.
- Cooking methods can also add weight to a dish:

Lighter-weight cooking methods:

poaching, steaming, sautéing

Heavier-weight cooking methods:

- o grilling, searing, braising, roasting, deep frying
- Higher alcohol wines like Zinfandel and Grenache have more weight and mouthfeel than lighter wines like Pinot Noir or Beaujolais.

The Regional Guideline

When in doubt, the failsafe method is the Regional Guideline – if it grows together, it goes together.

- Lamb and Cabernet Sauvignon (Bordeaux).
- Coq au Vin and Pinot Noir (Burgundy).
- Pork and Riesling (Germany).
- River fish and Sauvignon Blanc (Loire).
- Bresato and Barolo (Piedmont).
- Salmon and Pinot Noir (Oregon).

The Price Guideline

Match the dollar signs! If the food is high end, the wines should be too.

No matter which guideline you follow, always make sure the <u>weight</u> and <u>intensity</u> are similar – these are never ever contrasted!

Food & Wine Chemistry

We have receptors for FIVE TASTES: Salt, Sweet, Sour, Bitter & Umami

The most magical matches of food and wine are achieved when these elements of flavour are harmonized or opposed in ways that create alchemy.

Important interactions to know:

- Acidic wine with acidic food overall perception of acid is lower.
- Acid wine with sweet food overall impression is to heighten acid.
- Acidic wine with salty food wine will seem less acidic, rounder and fruiter.
- Salty food with sweet wine wine will seem fruity and bright.
- Salty food with tannins any bitterness will be diminished, wine will seem fruiter, richer.
- Tannic red wines are softened by salt, protein and fat.

Interactions to avoid:

- Fish and tannic red wine is seldom successful. Oils in fish make reds taste metallic and bitter. Choose lower tannin reds like Pinot Noir or Gamay for fish.
- Sweet food with dry wines does not work! The wine will taste sour and sharp. If the food is sweet, the wine must be at least as sweet. For savoury pairings like duck with cherry sauce, you will need a fruit-forward dry wine like California Pinot Noir.

Tricky ingredients that can fight with wine

- Asparagus/artichokes try Sauvignon Blanc.
- Spinach fruity white or red.
- Chocolate and ice cream intense, sweet wines are needed.
- Eggs dry sparkling wines are the go-to for egg dishes.
- Oily fish avoid any tannins, crisp whites and rosés are best.
- Smoked fish unoaked, high acidity and bubbles too!
- Vinegar must be paired with wines with sky-high acidity.
- Chili heat stick to lower alcohol wines like fruity Rieslings.
- Soy sauce fruit-forward wines from warmer climates will pair well.

Wine Service Temperatures

Champagne and Sparkling wines: $6 - 10 \circ C / 42 - 50 \circ F$

Dry lighter Whites and Rosés: $6 - 8 \circ C / 42 - 46 \circ F$

Dry rich Whites and Rosés: $6 - 10 \degree C / 42 - 50 \degree F$

Light-bodied Reds: 10 – 12 ° C / 50 – 55 ° F

Medium to full-bodied Reds: 12 - 18 ° C / 60 - 66 ° F (We call this European room temperature!)

Sweet wines: 5 – 8 ° C / 40 – 45 ° F

(Fortified wines like Port and Sherry should be served at cool temperature; Fino and Tawny styles can have a slight chill.)

A Love Story FALLING IN LOVE WITH ROMEO Y JULIETA

Synonymous with rich flavours and aromas, Romeo Y Julieta remains queen of the humidor, as its vintage limited editions blossom into collector favourites.





B eloved by collectors for its rich flavours and aromas, Romeo y Julieta may be a brand best enjoyed by vintages. Sometimes showing their youth, cigars from the brand have a reputation for coming into their own as vintages mature and bold flavours mellow into soothing notes of Cuba's most poetic tobacco.

Of the most recent limited editions, released in 2013, 2016 and 2018, it is the 2018 Tacos Edición Limitada that stand out as a must have vintage from the brand. Already exemplary at its launch for its extraordinary flavour and quality, the 2018 Tacos have emerged over time as perhaps the best aging cigars of the three releases. Weighing in at 6 5/8" in length with a gauge of 49, the Tacos is a well constructed Churchill, almost oily to the touch and with a firm draw. Notes of spice, wood and nuts punctuate the 2018 edition's flavour profile, in a medley finetuned and harmonized with age.

Elevating the experience of an aromatic cigar like the 2018 Tacos, we recommend choosing a smooth, full-bodied *digestif*, like Rémy Martin's XO cognac. Going strength for strength with the Cuban heavy weight, but with the more refined palate of a cognac made from fine Champagne *crus*, Rémy Martin's XO sets the stage for the Tacos to show its personality. Aged at least 10 years, up to 400 different *eaux-de-vie* are drawn from to blend a single Rémy Martin XO cognac. The result is a silky smoothness which is expected from a cognac of this calibre, but which finishes with the light, fruity or honey notes of a fine Champagne *eau-de-vie*.

The Last Word

THE FABRIC OF TIME

Rekindling a six-hundred-year-old family connection, almost.

t was in the 1990s that I was first introduced to the Ricci brand, after the opening of their New York boutique with its vast expanses of burl walnut and elegant, clubby atmosphere. The boutique was more than just a store, it was a portal into one man's gloriously inspired world.

The story of my family's history with the fabric trading Ricci family of Florence, however, does not begin in the 1990s, but rather in the early 15th century. Patricians in what is now the city of Wrocław, the Banck family occupied themselves as bankers and international brokers, importing spices and fabrics from Italy and exporting furs and metal ores. It was in Venice that Johann Banke took on a trading partner from a family of Florentine fabric merchants, named Antonio Ricci.

Fine fabrics like silk are noted to have changed hands between the Riccis of Florence and the Bancks of Silesian Breslau, with the Banck family providing fur pelts in return. The trade partnership continued until the 1420s, when – like so much of the intrigue from this period – it took a dark and tumultuous turn. On a much more cheerful autumn day in Vancouver, I made my way toward the Stefano Ricci boutique to meet Manuel Bernaschek, president of Steffano Ricci Vancouver, along with the brand's CEO. Walking down the sidewalk, I was wearing a black damask Stefano Ricci facemask, and considered how this little piece of silk could represented the reunion of two ancient trading families – disconnected since the days when our ancestors did business in Venice, six hundred years ago.

Visiting the city alongside master-tailors for a client meet and greet, CEO Niccolò Ricci now heads the firm that bears his father's name. Unfamiliar with the 15th century Antonio Ricci, Niccolò and I concluding our business with no corroboration of our possible family connection. What I can confirm, however, is that Manuel Bernaschek has brought something truly extraordinary to Vancouver: the opportunity to step into the gloriously inspired world of Stefano Ricci.
